There has been an increase in residential burglaries and auto thefts and most times the police find that the perpetrators did not have to break in. Her final warning was to please be extra careful when shopping at the Lotto Plaza off Georgia Avenue because there has been a lot of crime in that particular area recently.

Gleanings from Meetings

The May meeting of the Montgomery County Civic Federation (MCCF) focused on the approximately 90,000 acre portion of Montgomery County land designated as the Agricultural Reserve. It constitutes about 1/3 of Montgomery County's land area and was created as a permanent agricultural area in 1980. Prior to that, residential restrictions allowed one house for every five acres; subsequently, one house was permitted for every 25 acres. In economic terms, agriculture in Montgomery County accounts for \$243 million in financial activity and employs more than 10,000 people. Jeremy Criss is the Agricultural Services Division Manager in the County's Department of Economic Development.


The Agricultural Reserve benefits county residents by providing local farm products such as fruits, vegetables, dairy, wine, wool and livestock. The representatives from county government and the Montgomery Countryside Alliance discussed the advantages of maintaining the Reserve in terms of environmental and recreational advantages as well as providing a source for local, sustainable food production. Additional points made by the presenters included: appropriate incentives are needed to encourage more individuals and families to become farmers (longer term leases make sense for farmers); current criteria such as the 1959 state law requiring an owner to show \$2,500 in income to order to keep an agricultural reserve preferred tax status need to be re-examined; and the county needs to guard against the Reserve being bisected by the outer Beltway and bridge currently provided for in Virginia's six year transportation plan. In recent months the Montgomery County
Taxpayers League has been gathering
information, formulating proposals and providing
testimony to the Montgomery County Council
about the county's budget shortfall. Recent
proposals to help close the gap such as
increases in energy taxes and cell phone taxes
have been referenced in various news media. This
month the League's Executive Committee
decided to postpone the regularly scheduled May
20th meeting and re-schedule it on June 3rd

The New Civic Association Email Group

Early this year, the Civic Association board voted to set up a listserve for Civic Association members. Our goal is to provide our community with a new, timely and interactive communication channel to supplement *The Bugle*. (Don't worry, there are <u>NO plans</u> to use email to replace *The Bugle*.)

We sent out the first invitations in late March to Civic Association members who supplied their email addresses during last year's membership drive. As of April 18th, the group had 33 members.

We are using Yahoo's free groups service. Yahoo's service is well established and offers features that allow members to customize the format and frequency of messages. Messages can be received as individual messages, as a daily digest of all messages that day, or viewed on the Yahoo site without ever receiving messages. Message format can be fully-featured (with formatting and color similar to a web page) or plain text only. Finally, Yahoo allows members to hide their email address from group members if they choose.

There are two ways to join the group. The best way is to create a Yahoo ID, or use an existing one, and use that ID to request membership in the group. Follow the steps in the nearby box to join the group this way. This method allows you to access the message customization features mentioned above. Alternatively, you can join the group by sending me an email (johnbogasky@hotmail.com) from the address where you wish to receive group messages. This will add you to the group with the default customization options. Under either method, I will need your name and street address to verify that you are a Civic Association member in good standing.

Its easy to join the Civic Association if you want to join the group. All Strathmore Bel Pre residents can join the Civic Association at any time simply by paying the \$15 annual membership fee. If you wish to join, simply contact any member of the Civic Association board. You can find contact information for all board members on the back front cover of any edition of *The Bugle*.

All of us on the Civic Association Board hope that all members will join this group. We are excited about the possibilities the group offers to improve our ability to work together as a community. If you have any questions about the group, please contact me.

How to Join the SBPcivic Yahoo Group

- 1) Go to http://groups.yahoo.com/group/SBPcivic/ and click on the "Join this Group" button.
- 2) Sign-In to Yahoo or Create A New Yahoo Account. If you have a Yahoo ID, sign in. If not, you will need to create one. (Click "Sign Up" under the "Don't have a Yahoo ID?" heading.) Note, Yahoo creates a new email address when you create your Yahoo ID but don't worry, you don't need to use this email address to join the group.
- 3) After you sign-in to Yahoo, Yahoo presents options for customizing your SBPcivic group membership. To use your personal email address instead of the Yahoo address click "add new email address" and add your personal email address. Yahoo will provide instructions to verify this address. Once the address is verified, you can set it as your primary address for receiving SBPcivic messages.
- 4) If you wish to keep your personal email address private, click the "Hide my email and IP address from the group moderators" check box. Note that hiding your email address will prevent you from sending messages to the group.
- 5) Please identify your real name and street address in the "Comment to Owner" box.
- 6) Choose a message delivery preference . I recommend "individual emails" since message volume on the group is still low.
- 7) Choose a message preference. Most users should select the "fully-featured" option. The "traditional" option is for those who prefer plain-text email.
- 8) Enter the code displayed in the box and then press "Join" in the lower right corner.
- 9) Yahoo will send your membership request to me as the group moderator. Once I approve your SBPcivic membership request, you will receive a confirmation email and a welcome email.



because the County Council will be acting on the FY 2011 budget May 27th. At last month's meeting of the Taxpayers League, the members considered a number of cost saving suggestions that they anticipated sharing with the County Council. One suggestion was to for the county to consider adopting the Federal Government's percentage contribution to employees' health benefits. The County Council President, Nancy Floreen, joined the meeting and engaged in an extensive discussion with the members about budget issues and options. An interesting point made by a League member related to the State of Maryland's millionaires' tax which was adopted two years ago. It seems that Montgomery County's revenue from that tax has dropped by 75% in those two years.



The Bel Pre Recreation Association has taken additional steps to prevent trespassing after hours on the pool property. New, more secure locks have been installed; lighting has been upgraded; barbedwire fencing has been repaired; new signs have been put up; and, most importantly, improved security cameras have been installed.
