

Management Company? or Community-Run???

In the last issue of *The Bugle*, Rec Association Treasurer PATRICK Welteroth posted an appeal for help with the treasury and book-keeping functions of the organization. Several members of the community responded, but none of them were been in a position to commit more than a few hours a month, which is less than Patrick needed.



PATRICK has now announced that he is stepping down as Treasurer. He will be missed.

The Board is now faced with a problem. Do we need to go to a management company? In 1973, Levitt & Sons turned control of the Bel Pre Recreational Association over to the community. Since that time, we have never hired a management company. We've hired bookkeepers from time to time, attorneys when there were legal issues, and auditors for the annual financial audit. But we've never used a management company, which I believe has been a key element in keeping our community-friendly, very personal, neighbor -focused, casual nature of our pool.

LAST CALL

With Patrick's upcoming departure, something has to done, NOW!. Three potential management companies have been identified and the Board is starting the process of examining them. So this is a last call. We need volunteers to take on the treasury and bookkeeping functions of the Association, including the household dues assessment records, late fees, outstanding assessments, payments, expenses, etc. You don't have to be a CPA, accountant, or bookkeeper, or know Quick Books -- though that would be outstanding if you do. You do need time, attention to detail, and recordkeeping skills. If you're willing to take any part of this on, please get in touch with me at echabot@usa.net or (301) 871-1113.

Still reading and but not inspired to volunteer? Use of a management company to handle the Rec Association record keeping and financial matters will cost the Association in the neighborhood of \$10,000 per year.



Bathhouse Roof - Interim Repair

In the May issue of *The Bugle*, I incorrectly reported that replacing the roof of the bathhouse was one of the projects that we hoped to have done before the start of the summer. The project approved by the Board was not to replace the roof, but was to repair and resurface the roof. My apologies for the error.

As we go to press, work on the roof is currently scheduled to start June 3 and be finished before June 14. The bathhouse should remain operational during regular pool hours for the entire time.

The intent of the Board is to have a solution for the bathhouse roof that we hope will get us through the next 5 years, so that a long-term strategy can be adopted for the bathhouse. The bathhouse is 50 years old. What should be our long term plans for that community building?



Pool Passes

Each February (in the annual assessment notice), every BPRA member household is given the option of either "household admission" or "season passes". Households that opt for the "season passes" get 2 barer passes that are good to admit one person each for the entire summer season. If you opt for "household admission", then there is a census form to list all the



members of your household that you send in every few years, along with a current photo of the household members. With the "household admission" option, all the members of your household, as indentified on the census form, are entitled to use the pool for the entire summer season.

If you opted for "season passes" and haven't received your 2019 passes yet, or if you opted for "household admission" and you haven't updated your census form or photographs in the last few years, then please contact our Pool Pass Coordinator LOUISA HOAR at (301) 871-2954 and she'll help you with what you need.



News from the Glenmont Exchange

Ride-On Flex

Ride-On's new FLEX bus service Pilot beginning operations on June 26th. will allow riders to request trips within the zone from a pick up corner to a drop off corner using an app on their mobile phones. An 11-passenger bus will provide service within the geographical zone pictured at right.

The Pilot includes all of the SBP neighborhood south of the Henson Trail plus a small section that is south of Hewitt Avenue. Wheaton Plaza, Glenmont Metro, and Glenmont Shopping Center are within the zone. If you are in the zone, you can ask for the bus to pick you up at an intersection near you for a trip to any other intersection in the zone. Riders will be given an estimated time for pick up and drop off and directed to a nearby corner to meet the bus.

- •Fares will be the same as the regular Ride-On bus, usually \$2 per ride.
- Service hours are limited. Weekdays only from 6AM-9AM and 3:30-7PM.
- Vehicles are wheelchair-accessible and all trips must be reserved through the mobile app.

The service will only take SmarTrip cards, passes, tokens, and cash. You cannot add value (cash/tokens) onto a SmarTrip card on Flex. Always have enough fare on your card, or use cash/tokens/passes on these buses.

This is a one year pilot. There is a second pilot area just south of Rockville Town Center. You can find more information at www.montgomerycountymd.gov/DOT-Transit/flex/.

We expect to have a Ride-On Flex representative at the pool pavilion on Thursday, **July 11** at 7:30 pm to describe the service and answer your questions.



Primrose Layhill Child Care Center - Additional Details

The Montgomery County Planning Board had a hearing to review these plans on May $23^{\rm rd}$. Planning documents released for that hearing provide new details. The developer will pay for installing a pedestrian crossing at the intersection of Layhill Road and Queensguard Road. In addition, the developer will pay for restriping Queensguard Road from 2 lanes to 3 lanes and widening the sidewalk on the south side from 4 feet

to 5 feet. They will also add pay for a new 10-foot-wide sidepath along Layhill Road along the property frontage. Finally, the developer will pay for relocating the bus stop along Layhill to provide adequate sight distance for vehicles turning from Queensgard Road onto Layhill.

Kaiser Permanente Coming to Aspen Hill

Last October's issue of *The Bugle* reported that Lindsay Ford had received site plan approval from the County Planning Board to proceed with their plans to build a Ford dealership on the old Vitro



Labs/BAE (south) property at Connecticut Avenue and Aspen Hill Road. (The Vitro Labs north property is where the Aspen Hill Home Depot is now located.) Lindsay had been working for some time with representatives of the Aspen Hill Civic Association (with representation from the Strathmore Bel Pre Civic Association) in their desire to become an active member of the community and to be an asset to and resource to Aspen Hill and the surrounding neighborhoods.

Lindsey Ford Sells their Aspen Hill Property

All of this has changed. In late March, MICHAEL LINDSAY announced that, due to the growing development costs of the project, his family had decided to sell the property. The new owner is heath care provider Kaiser Permanente. In announcing his personal disappointment that the project had not come to be, LINDSAY indicated that he wanted everyone to know how much he appreciated the opportunity and privilege to have worked with the Aspen Hill Civic Association in such a positive and constructive way, and that the level of community involvement had inspired him and made him want even more to be a corporate citizen in our neighborhood.

Negotiations with Kaiser Permanente



The Aspen Hill Civic Association continues to be the lead community group in discussions with the new property owner. Kaiser representative ADRIAN HAGERTY (Planning and Design Team Manager with Kaiser Mid-Atlantic States' National Facilities Services) indicated that the Aspen Hill facility (which they hope to have operational by 2022) would be in addition to (and not a replacement of) Kaiser's Kensington facilities and their other facilities in Montgomery County. They anticipate that (at least initially) the Aspen Hill facility would not have urgent care services. It would function Monday through Friday, from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Just as with Lindsay Ford, Kaiser expects that all non-emergency traffic into the property will be through Connecticut Avenue. Pending approval by the County Planning Board, their preference would be to build their facility on the existing Vitro Labs building foundation. HAGERTY has indicated that Kaiser wants to expand medical wellness services to the community -- not just to Kaiser Permanente members who live in the area. Kaiser is looking at having walking/fitness trails on the property. If the community is amenable, they would also like to establish a farmers' market on the property similar to the weekly farmers' market that is currently being held at Kaiser's Kensington Connecticut Avenue facility. HAGERTY also indicated that Kaiser would like to make the conference rooms in the facility available for use by community organizations when they're not being used by Kaiser.

Discussions between Aspen Hill Civic Association and Kaiser are expected to continue through the development of the project.







Repairs and Maintenance

With a 50-year old facility and over 6 acres of land, there is always much constant maintenance and repair work to be done at the pool and the community's recreational facilities at 13920 Bethpage Lane. White Coating and Tile Replacement

If you came by the pool property during May — in the weeks leading up to the pool opening for Memorial Day weekend — you would have seen an enormous amount of activity. In addition to all the things that normally get done to get the pool and grounds ready for opening day, we also had the pool re-plastered (white coated), and removed and replaced the tiles, and upgraded the finish on the kids' pool. This is a huge operation and takes place once every 10 years or so.

Main Pool Pump

A once in a quarter century replacement occurred on Tuesday, May 28, when the Pump for the main pool failed. Thanks to hard work by our volunteers and contractors, the main pool was back in operation by Thursday, May 30. Thanks especially to JOE MOELLER and CLARK BOUGHER for getting all the pieces together. Aspen Hill Vision Zero: Preliminary Staff Recommendations

The Aspen Hill Vision Zero Study is an effort by the Montgomery County Planning Board to eliminate pedestrian and traffic deaths and serious injuries in central Aspen Hill. The study is focused particularly on the shopping areas in and around the triangle of Aspen Hill Road, Georgia Avenue, and Connecticut Avenue. It also includes the neighborhoods of Harmony Hills and Wheaton Woods and the neighborhoods between Bel Pre Road, Connecticut Avenue, and Georgia Avenue. While Strathmore Bel Pre is slightly outside the study area, Planning Board staff has indicated they are open to considering the needs of adjacent communities - particularly within a quarter mile of study boundaries.

The Vision Zero staff has issued its very preliminary recommendations, and has asked for feedback from the community before staff finalizes its recommendations, and then forwards them to the County Planning Board.

Preliminary Recommendations Include



- ➤ Eliminate right turn on red
- ➤ Eliminate or reconfigure the "channelized" right turn lanes that allow drivers to avoid traffic lights
- ➤ Put crosswalks on all sides of intersections that have traffic lights
- ➤ Replace all push-button pedestrian walk lights with automatic walk lights
- ➤ Relocate all utility poles and fire hydrants that interfere with sidewalks
- ➤ Reduce the speed limit on Connecticut Avenue (between Bel Pre Road and Independence Street) to 35 MPH and lower the speed limit on Aspen Hill Road to 25 MPH.
- ➤ Shrink the interior travel lanes on Georgia Avenue and on Connecticut Avenue to 10 feet width
- ➤ Reconfigure the Georgia Avenue access to Home Depot
- ➤ Add bump-outs at intersections on Parkland Drive from Veirs Mill Road to Aspen Hill Road.
- Implement a bilingual bus shelter education campaign

Other recommendations that have raised within the Aspen Hill Vision Zero Advisory Group include, installing sidewalks on major walking routes to local elementary schools and marking the road pavement showing where pedestrians should walk, on streets that do not have sidewalks.

Send Your Comments on the Preliminary Recommendations

The Planning Board staff welcomes comments on these preliminary recommendations, as well as other suggestions for eliminating pedestrian and traffic deaths and serious injuries in the area. The Montgomery County Department of Transportation is now seeking input on its plan to create a pedestrian- and bike-friendly connection between the Glenmont Metro Station and the Aspen Hill and Northgate Shopping Centers. 
