

Annual Assessments

Thank you to all members who have already paid their \$350 annual assessment. If you have not yet paid your 2022 annual assessment, please contact BPRA Treasurer Dave Pullen (treasurer4bpra@gmail.com or (301) 598-2521) to arrange payment and confirm the



amount due. Payments made after March 31 are subject to a \$35.00 late fee, 6% per annum (\$1.75/month) interest, and collection costs. NO Access to the pool and recreational facilities is permitted for households with accounts in arrears.

Pool Opening Summer 2022

The pool is scheduled to open at noon on **May 28, 2022**. As of now, we expect to operate in accordance with normal Recreational Facilities Policy rules, including several recent updates.

Pool rules and procedures are subject to change at any time before or during the summer based on the ever-changing COVID situation. Any updates will be posted online at StrathmoreBelPre.org and shared via both the SBP Civic and SBP Dolphins listservs. Signs will also be posted at the pool.

Please take a few minutes to visit <u>StrathmoreBelPre.org</u> and familiarize yourself with the Recreational Facilities Policy, including recent updates, before the start of the 2022 swim season.

The Recreational Facilities Policy and updates can be found on <u>StrathmoreBelPre.org/government-documents</u> under the heading **Rules for Pool and Facilities Use; and other policies.** The Recreational Facilities Policy, including pool rules, will also be posted at the pool.

Pool Hours Summer 2022

The summary: On Montgomery County Public School (MCPS) school days, the pool opens at 3 pm. On MCPS school nights (i.e., there is school the next day), the pool closes at 8 pm. Otherwise, the pool is generally open 12 pm to 9 pm except for July 4th (noon to 6 pm).


Strathmore Bel Pre Dolphins News

SPRING SONGS

Have you noticed that our mornings are filling up with music? Spring birdsong starts in late winter, but as the hormones hit high gear, songs magnify and multiply. Birds are claiming territories and mates.

"Birdwatching" is done with more than the eyes. If you learn the songs of a few common species, it can open up the world. And if you hear a bird harmonizing with itself, that's because birds have a syrinx, a more elaborate mechanism than our own larynx, and one that will let a bird sing two notes at once.



Our backyard birds are at their most charming in spring, especially the **Northern Cardinal**, which gives us both visual and auditory pleasure. The scarlet male goes to the black-oil sunflower feeder, takes a seed, and feeds it to his mate. Human observers melt with romance, but in fact, the female needs protein to make eggs; the courtly gift is both a bond and a boon.

An audible bond is the pair's counter-singing. Both male and female cardinals sing, whistling cheerful phrases in a turnabout duet. The female, seen here, will even sing from the nest.

House Finches pour out long serenades from trees, wires, and chimneys. Tiny House Wrens arrive from

southern climes to fill the air with musical cascades. The Northern Mockingbird that owns our front yard will soon be improvising almost all night long: a sound guaranteed to bring me good dreams.

The bird with "song" in its very name is the **Song Sparrow**, shown at right. It was a favorite with the American colonists, who named it for its immense repertoire. The male singing from your rooftop may often start with three long notes, but what follows will be a series of trills and short sharp notes of almost infinite variation. This has been represented as "Maids, maids, maids, put on your tea kettle-ettle-ettle!" It's not a set playlist—the Song Sparrow shuffles his songs.

In spring, the air trembles with the scents of moist earth and sun-warmed leaves. Warblers return to flit through our treetops, adding splashes of color and activity to spring's dappled-green light. Warblers don't warble, though. Some sing slow buzzy songs like the Black-throated Blue Warbler, or run a dash up the scale like the Prairie, or jazz into a trill

that rises above my hearing range like the Blackburnian. Warblers rock the soundtrack.

In *Spring in Washington*, LOUIS HALLE wrote, "...it seems to me the singing of birds is the purest form for the expression of natural beauty and goodness in the larger sense...." If the dazzle of birdsong on a spring morning makes you want to learn our songsters, check into apps like Larkwire, or Merlin ID from the Cornell Lab of Ornithology, or listen to "Birding by Ear," a great set of CDs. Knowing some common birdsongs will enhance your experience, whether you're on a neighborhood walk or hiking on a forest path. Activate your sonic sensors! You're listening to Spring.

Once again, the Scouts of Pack and Troop 763 (sponsored by the Strathmore Bel Pre Civic Association) did an Earth Day cleanup in our corner of the world the Matthew Hensen trail starting at Rippling Brook Drive.

We found an extraordinary number of beer bottles, a shopping cart from CVS and a large amount of recycling. It is very probable that most of the recyclable items came from the bins of the Strathmore Bel

Pre neighborhood, as there were 2 days in the past months when it was very windy during the curbside trash pickup days.

All the things that the wind tossed out of our recycling bins were thrown into the street, where the rain and wind washes them down into the storms drains, which exit directly to the closest waterway. For example, all the rain water for Blue Spruce Lane gets drained into a storm drain at the bottom of the hill, goes through a underground culvert and then gets dumped near the pedestrian bridge on the Matthew Hensen trail near Rippling Brook Drive. The large stormwater wetland area there is where the dirt, oil and trash of Blue Spruce Lane ends up. So many times we think of littering as something that "someone else" is doing when often we are just as likely to be the culprits.

Plan to Use the Pool this Summer? Here's How.

Pool Check-in (Where are my paper Season Passes?)

We have transitioned to a Household-based pool entry system. This means no one will receive paper pool passes this summer.

The current policy allows for admission for all individuals residing in your home and additional family members as specified in the BPRA Recreational Facilities Policy. Names and photos of each household member must be on file in eSoft Planner.

Once you have 1) paid your 2022 BPRA Annual Assessment (and any outstanding prior year balances) and 2) are properly set up in the BPRA eSoft Planner pool check-in and assessment collection system, you will simply check in with your name at the front desk.

Pool staff will rely on member-provided information in the eSoft Planner system to manage pool access, so PLEASE be sure that your information is correct and complete.

What do you need to do to make sure you are ready to check in at the pool? Three easy steps.

- 1. Pay your 2022 BPRA Annual Assessment and any outstanding balances.
- 2. Log into your eSoft Planner account, hover over My Account, click My Memberships.
 - Verify that 2022 BPRA Annual Assessment due March 1, 2022 is listed under Swim Memberships Purchased/Enrolled AND that all appropriate/eligible household members are listed for pool check-in under the Family Member column associated with the 2022 BPRA Annual Assessment – due March 1, 2022 membership. This is the screenshot:

If you paid your assessment online, you may have completed all the necessary steps. Please log into your account to verify that the correct household members are listed and that photos have been uploaded.

If you paid your assessment by paper check AND completed the household information on the assessment form, a volunteer entered this information into your eSoft Planner account. Please log into your account to verify that the correct household members are listed and that photos have been uploaded.

If you paid your assessment by paper check and did not submit or update your household information, either on the assessment form *or* online in eSoft Planner, you will likely see only one or two names listed. Please log into your account to verify that the correct household members are listed and that photos have been uploaded. To add household names for pool check-in, you will need to complete the eSoft Planner Help Form at StrathmoreBelPre.org/pool-access-esoft.

What if I need help?

If you need assistance with eSoft Planner, please stop by the pool parking lot between 2 pm and 4 pm on Saturday, **May 14**, during the Spring Thing. We will have computers available and will be able to help you check the status of your account, upload photos and answer any questions you may have about the system.

Alternately, you may visit <u>StrathmoreBelPre.org/pool-access-esoft</u> and complete the eSoft Planner help form (preferred) or email <u>BPRAPool02@gmail.com</u>. If you do not have access to a computer or email, please call me at (301) 603-9604 before 8 pm for assistance.

Tennis and Pickleball







Street Trees in our Neighborhood

If you drive through the neighborhood, you'll notice that there was a plan for street trees. Maples along Beret Lane, double-blossomed ornamental cherries along Rippling Brook in the south section of Strathmore Bel Pre, Bradford pears on Belle Crest Lane, oaks along Breeze Hill and Broomall Lanes and Japanese flowering cherry trees along Rippling Brook (north section), Blue Spruce Lane and Burning Bush Lane.



Flowering Cherry Trees here?

What's that? You don't notice the cherry trees on Blue Spruce Lane? A few are still there, the hardy survivors of winters that are just a teeny tiny bit too cold for them. Many cherry trees have thin bark, with the sap underneath very susceptible to freezing when overnight temps drop. The sap expands as it freezes, causing the bark to split and often causing the demise of the tree. These trees will do much better inside the Beltway, where the freeze date is 2 weeks before in spring and often more than 3 weeks later in the fall. They also do well in microclimates that stay just slightly warmer or on hills where the cold air

flowing down the hill will prevent a hard freeze. You'll see this to spectacular effect on Burning Bush Lane, where there are many mature cherry trees. If you really like flowering cherry trees, then you can choose from the many available varieties. However, none of the more cold tolerant options will have the ethereal blossoms that come out very early and before any leaves show, creating a cloud of the palest pink. There's nothing like it.

Bradford Pear Trees

There's also nothing like Bradford pear, which has stinky flowers, weak branches, gets compared to thornbushes, doesn't live more than 30 years and is certainly not sterile as it was advertised. It's not a great street tree and is terrible for nature, as it has been compared to kudzu.

Great Street Trees

So what does make a great street tree? Being small, beautiful and compact. You want to choose a tree that doesn't not attract wildlife, as you don't want to encourage deer and birds to come into the street and get hit by cars. While holly, American crabapple, paw paw, dogwood, American plum and serviceberry are great options for your yard, consider planting them away from the street. Being native also makes for a great street tree - redbud has beautiful pink blossoms and attractive heart shaped leaves, as does fringetree and magnolias. I will also add crepe myrtle to the list, although not technically native to Maryland, it is tough and beautiful with long lasting late summer blooms. For full beauty, do not cut or prune crepe myrtle, as it is not necessary (Google "crepe murder" for more info).

Need some incentives?

Montgomery county government is offering \$40 coupons as part of its Reforest Montgomery program and the state has \$25 coupons that can be used together to buy a native tree. The state also has a backyard buffer bundle for owners who live near streams or storm drains. Find out more here, download the coupons and see the list of participating nurseries here: https://treemontgomery.org/other-planting-programs/.

Friends of Native Trees in Takoma Park

The <u>Takoma Park Native Tree Selection Guide</u> is available to view and download on the **Friends of Native Trees in Takoma** website, <u>fontt.org</u>. The guide features trees that are native to Maryland and "not rare" in Montgomery County and one or more neighboring counties. The target audience is anyone in the area with a yard or land to plant a native tree, especially people who are not particularly aware of the benefits of native trees.

Candidate Forums

Every even-numbered year is an election year in Maryland – and 2022 is no exception. This year, the Strathmore Bel Pre Civic Association has continued the tradition of co-sponsoring a series of candidates' forums in the months leading up to the primary and general elections. Each forum gives the candidates for particular



offices the chance to speak to the community and – most importantly – devotes most of the time to questions from the audience and (hopefully) answers from the candidates.

During May and June, the following forums have been scheduled (starting at 7:30 pm):

Thursday, May 5, State Senate and House of Delegates (District 19)

Thursday, May 12, County Council (District 6)

Wednesday, May 25, School Board (At Large and District 5)

Wednesday, **June 1**, School Board (Districts 1 and 3)

Wednesday, June 15, Montgomery County State's Attorney

Note that voters in Strathmore Bel Pre get to vote on all 4 School Board seats (At Large and Districts 1, 3, and 5).

The forums are being jointly sponsored by our civic association, along with the Friends of the Aspen Hill Library, Aspen Hill Library Advisory Committee, Aspen Hill Civic Association and Glenmont Exchange. The forums are part of the Aspen Hill Public Affairs Series that started in 1984.

To Attend the Forums

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, all of the May and June forums will be held on Zoom. To register to get the Zoom sign-on information for the forums, send an e-mail at AspenHillForums@gmail.com and include "Candidate Forum" in the subject line. If you have questions that you would like posed to the candidates, please send them to the same address.

Earlier this year, forums were held featuring the candidates running for County Council at large (March 10) and County Executive (April 7).

Election Days

This year's Primary Election will take place on Tuesday, **July 19**, and the General Election will take place on Tuesday, **November 8**. Polls are open from 7 am to 8 pm. Strathmore Bel Pre voters who live north of the Henson Trail vote at Argyle Middle School. Strathmore Bel Pre voters who live south of the Henson Trail vote at Georgian Forest Elementary School.

Early Voting for 2022

If you don't want to wait until election day, early voting is also available at 14 locations throughout Montgomery County, including the Mid-County Recreation Center (2004 Queensguard Road), the Bauer Drive Recreation Center (14625 Bauer Drive), and the Wheaton Library & Recreation Center (11701 Georgia Avenue). Early voting for the Primary Election will be available from **July 7 to 14**; and early voting for the General Election will be available from **October 27 to November 3**). The 14 early voting locations will be open those days from 7 am to 8 pm.
