

Recreational Facilities Policy – worth a read

The Recreational Facilities Policy and updates can be found on <u>StrathmoreBelPre.org/government-documents</u> under the heading **Rules for Pool and Facilities Use; and other policies.** The Recreational Facilities Policy, including pool rules, will also be posted at the pool. Please note that these rules may change at any time based on the ever-changing COVID situation.

Pool Hours Summer 2022

The summary: On MCPS school days, the pool opens at 3 p.m. On MCPS school nights (i.e., there is school the next day), the pool closes at 8pm. Otherwise, the pool is generally open noon to 9 p.m. except for July 4th (noon to 6 p.m.).

The details:

May 28, May 29: noon to 9 pm May 30 (Memorial Day): noon to 8 pm May 31 to June 17* Monday through Thursday: 3 pm to 8 pm Friday: 3 pm to 9 pm Saturday: noon to 9 pm Sunday: noon to 8 pm June 18* to August 27** July 4: noon to 6 pm All other days: noon to 9 pm August 28** to September 3: Monday through Thursday: 3 pm to 8 pm Friday: 3 pm to 9 pm Saturday: noon to 9 pm Sunday: noon to 9 pm September 4 (Sunday): noon to 9 pm September 5 (Labor Day): noon to 8 pm

* dates are based on the last day of school for Montgomery County Public Schools and are subject to change based on the school calendar.

** dates are based on the first day of school for Montgomery County Public Schools and are subject to change based on the school calendar. School starts Monday, August 29, 2022.

Changes to pool hours will be announced via signs posted at the pool, online at <u>StrathmoreBelPre.org</u>, and through both the community and swim team listservs.

Pool Check-in

We have transitioned to a Household-based pool entry system. This means no one will receive paper pool passes this summer.

Once you have paid your 2022 BPRA Annual Assessment (and any outstanding prior year balances) and are properly set up in the BPRA eSoft Planner pool check-in and

assessment collection system, you will simply check in with your name at the front desk.

Please see the May 2022 *Bugle* (pp. 11-12) for detailed information about how to make sure your eSoft Planner account is properly set up for pool check in.

If you are a new resident, renter, or landlord, please visit <u>StrathmoreBelPre.org/pool-access-esoft</u> for information on how to get set up for pool check-in. Renters and/or landlords need to complete the help form each summer so that we have accurate records of who is authorized for pool use for a rental property.

Snack Bar

Once again, this summer, SBP resident, *Bugle* sponsor, and Pizza Stop owner ROD OO, will be operating the snack bar. More information about an opening date (likely once Montgomery County Public Schools close for the summer), operating hours and a new menu will be coming soon.

Pavilion Reservations? Events on the Pool Grounds?



To reserve the pavilion, OR to have an event anywhere on the pool grounds, please send an email to <u>BPRAPool04@gmail.com</u>. Include your name, address, phone number, type of event, time and date requested, number of total anticipated attendees, number of anticipated BPRA members and number of anticipated non-BPRA members. Alternatively, you may leave a message for BPRA Pavilion Coordinator CARMEN WONG at (301) 523-0485.

Only BPRA members in good standing may reserve the pavilion. Reservations are generally taken on a first-come first-serve basis and use of the pavilion or the pool with 10 or more guests normally requires approval at a meeting of the Board of Trustees. The Board usually meets only once a month.

Before submitting a request, please visit <u>StrathmoreBelPre.org</u> to review the Recreational Facilities Policy related to Guests (sections 206 to 212) and Pavilion Use (Part 6.).

Our Neighborhood Trees – Tulip Trees

It's mid-May as I write this, and these trees are in full bloom. You may not notice the flowers until they fall on the ground, but it's beloved by hummingbirds and other pollinators. Do you have big mature shade trees in your yard? Chances are good that it is the tree by many names: tulip poplar, tulip tree, yellow poplar or Tulip-Wood, all common names for one of the biggest deciduous trees in eastern North America. Approximately 1 in 4 trees on the Matthew



Henson trail are tulip poplars, as they tend to dominate forests in the early stages of succession (forests that are 50-150 years old, common in Montgomery County).

The Aspen Hill area was rapidly developed in the 1950's as farming the area ended and some areas were allowed to return to forests. Both red cedar and tulip trees were first on the scene, as they are fast growing trees that like a lot of sun. Tulip poplars tend to like the moister areas and will shoot up 40 feet in the first 15 years of their life, putting on an additional 2 feet of height every year after that. Its strategy is to grow a straight trunk with a high canopy of branches that provide shade to the slow growers coming up underneath them (maples and oaks). In a mature forest of over 200 years, tulip poplars will be absent or completely rare, as fast growing also means a short life span for a tree.

Tulip trees are beautiful and easy to identify. The leaf is the only one with 4 points and is vaguely violin or vase shaped. The flower really does look like a tulip, and is big and cup-shaped, with green petals. By the end of May to early June, you'll see the flowers on the ground, with petals that have a very distinctive orange band. When winter arrives, look up and you'll still see the seeds, grouped together in a cone shaped structure, waiting for wind to blow them to the next sunny spot. It is very likely that you have seen the yellow and orange butterflies called tiger swallowtails, they will often lay their eggs on the leaves.



Tall Trees in Matthew Henson Park

When I drive down my street (Blue Spruce Lane) and look out at the trees that are in the Matthew Henson park, every tall tree is a tulip poplar. Heights of 50-150 feet are very common. Both the tallest tree in Maryland and in the eastern US is actually a tulip tree (coming in at the rather unimpressive 192 feet). If you love the big mature trees in your yard, then you probably love a tulip poplar. What you are not going to like is what comes next, which is that fast growing means weak wood. You can easily see a tulip poplar in the Matthew Henson lying on its side, as these trees fall easily. The wet soil that is very common for this area will lead to a small root system, meaning the tree is more likely to fall down after lots of rain and wind (also common with large white pines). This makes a large

tulip tree a bad idea for a tree near your house.

Weak Branched, and Providers of Shade

You'll feel the pain when it is time to cut them down, as most professionals recognize that tulip trees have weak branches and are more difficult/dangerous to cut down. There are a few ways to save money, the first is to cut the tree down to a 20-25 foot height. No branches will damage the house, and the tree may re-grow limbs. If the tree dies, then you have years of wildlife viewing enjoyment ahead of as woodpeckers move in to make cavities for their nests. In my yard, I have even seen bluebirds move in after the woodpeckers. Second, you can ask to have the trunk cut into firewood sized pieces and then split them. It is very easy to split, and will dry and burn quickly, being so lightweight. Third, ask to leave the branches in your yard instead of having them hauled away. You can cut up the branches a little at a time, placing them in yard waste cans to be taken away over several weeks.

But next time you enjoy a cool shady trail in the height of summer, thank the tulip poplars, beautiful native trees that are exactly where they belong. The Bugle June 2022 9

A Time to Dance

When I see or hear an Eastern bluebird, I cannot keep silent. "Bluebird!" comes out in a subdued shout. They were so scarce for so many years that now every sighting is a celebration. As I've been wandering our community, doing my ANS Birdathon, I've actually found two bluebird nests in old woodpecker holes near the Henson Trail. Both nests were active, with parents flying in with beaks full of insects—food for babies.

Many people in SBP have commented on seeing more bluebirds these days . It's wonderful to be able to say that bluebirds have bounced back.



Years ago, I was talking to a friend and praising the efforts being made to save a declining bird species. My friend said this appalling thing. "Maybe it was just its time to be over." Her tone was soothing. It implied: Don't mourn the loss, it's no big deal.

Stunned, trying to compromise, I said, "But why not preserve it if we can?" Her notion was that it wasn't important to humans, so it didn't matter.

The trouble is, we don't always know what's important to humans. After all, earthworms used to be thought a nuisance. Gardeners tried to get rid of them, probably fearing they ate plant roots. But Darwin's careful study, published in 1881, showed that, in fact, earthworms are bountiful friends, producing compost from detritus.

Humans evolved here with all this Nature-stuff inextricably woven around us. We're cutting holes in it. As ALDO LEOPOLD advised, we need to remember the first rule of tinkering: Keep all the parts.

Ecclesiastes 3 tells us there is "a time to mourn and a time to dance." Extinction merits mourning.

Eastern bluebird numbers plummeted because of human activity, changes in farming practices, and the proliferation of introduced species. Aggressive European starlings and house sparrows killed many bluebirds and took their nest sites. Recently, however, humans have been helping bluebirds. Nesting boxes, monitored to evict murderous intruders, and mounted in suitable habitat with predator guards, have



helped the sweet-voiced sky-birds recover. Leaving dead trees and stumps available to woodpeckers and other birds for nest sites is paying off as well. Breeding Bird Survey data show that Eastern bluebirds are now a species of low concern.

What's in it for us humans? If beauty isn't enough, we should at least be grateful for their insect control. For me, seeing Eastern bluebirds in my yard or in the meadow or wetlands near the Henson Trail brings joy. Any day with a bluebird in it is a time to dance.



Be on the Look Out for Cicada Killer Wasps

The Cicada Killer Wasp (Sphecius specious) is well known to most of those that frequent the pool in mid to late summer as they hover and buzz around the pool entrance and may seem to be a nuisance. These are the 747's of the insect world and while they look



intimidating and act belligerently, they rarely sting people. These 2" long black and yellow insects deserve to be considered as one of the good guys of the insect world, or beneficial, since Cicadas cause damage to trees. Cicadas are captured by these Wasps, hauled to their underground borrows for their larva to eat. At the pool, the burrows are easy to spot usually at the edge of the concrete sidewalk with soil piled up from the excavation. They are attracted by the warm south facing exposure of the Bathhouse and the relatively soft and dry soil. An irrigation system that operates frequently would likely discourage them from nesting, but we do not have such a system on the pool grounds.

Rather than living in a colony like honeybees, Cicada Killers are considered solitary. There is just one generation of wasps per year and the adults are active for 2-3 weeks in mid-summer. The females collect food supplies, construct burrows and lay eggs during this period. After mating the male wasps die, which is not uncommon with bees and wasps. The newly laid eggs hatch, they feed on the captured Cicada and the larva develop a cocoon to overwinter in the burrow. When spring comes the larva pupates then develop into an adult wasp and the cycle repeats.

While these insects can be considered a threat or nuisance initially, once one gains an understanding and appreciation for Cicada Killers, we usually have a better respect for their place in the natural world.

2022 Congressional, State and Local Elections

Ready to Vote in the Primary?

Your chance to vote in Maryland's Primary elections for Congressional, state, and local elections is coming very soon! Maryland no longer has a fall primary. Legislation several years ago moved the primary elections from the fall to early summer. This year, due to several Court challenges to the decennial redistricting maps, the primary date was moved several times, and finally became **Tuesday**, **July 19th!**

Who is on the Ballot? What Districts cover Strathmore Bel Pre Residents?

Hopefully, as a regular *Bugle* reader, this date is on your radar, and you have chosen your candidates for the assorted offices to be filled. If not, your days to do so are getting numbered. A list of candidates who will be on the ballot (and their websites) is available from the Maryland State Board of Elections (<u>https://elections.maryland.gov/elections/2022/primary_candidates/index.html</u>). Strathmore Bel Pre is in the 8th Congressional District, 19th State Legislative District, and 6th County Council District. If you're still not sure who to vote for, consider which candidates your neighbors thought so highly of that they've posted signs for them in their front yard.

Okay, Where Do I Vote? What Hours are the Polls Open?

Polls are open from 7 am to 8 pm. On election day, Strathmore Bel Pre voters who live north of the Henson Trail vote at Argyle Middle School. Strathmore Bel Pre voters who live south of the Henson Trail vote at Georgian Forest Elementary School.

Early Voting for 2022

If you don't want to wait until election day, early voting is also available at 14 locations throughout Montgomery County, including the Mid-County Recreation Center (2004 Queensguard Road), the Bauer Drive Recreation Center (14625 Bauer Drive), and the Wheaton Library & Recreation Center (11701 Georgia Avenue). Early voting for the Primary Election will be available from **July 7 to 14**; and early voting for the General Election will be available from **October 27 to November 3**. The 14 early voting locations will be open those days from 7 am to 8 pm.

General Election and Fall Candidates Forums

The General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 8.

More Candidates Forums will be held this Fall to cover assorted elections. The forums will be held on Zoom, and will be announced in advance on the Civic Association's listserv. Everyone is welcome to attend and to ask questions of the candidates.
