MICHAEL CHAMBERLIN is back with his Special July 4th magic! And Field Games for the kids.



Only Bel Pre Recreational Members (BPRA) members in good standing may reserve the pavilion. Reservations are generally taken on a first-come first-serve basis and use of the pavilion or the pool with 10 or more guests normally requires approval at a meeting of the Board of Trustees. The Board usually meets only once a month.

- By paying by credit card, you can manage your payment over time.


Further, you avoid additional charges associated with lingering non-payment such as interest and collection costs. Also you may have significant, additional expenses if we must refer your account to our attorneys.

BULLFROGS RULE!

Who's hanging out in our small local wetland, calling for a "jug o'rum" in a big bass voice? It's a male bullfrog, a species named for its bull-like bellow. The caller is likely to be in or near the pond or down by the creek. It may be sitting on a log or in the muddy leaves near the edge of the water, or cruising just below the water's surface, with only those big bulging eyes visible. If the frog is close enough and not agitated by too much company, you may see his throat bulge out as he calls.



That bellow is not the only sound these big amphibians make. Amazingly, their voices range from bass to soprano, and they can click, shriek, and even mew like a cat. When the day is warm and love is in the air, a bellow from the left side of the pond may be answered by a cluck elsewhere and then a couple of clicks—a fierce or flirty froggy conversation.



Like other amphibians, bullfrogs need water to keep their skin moist and to raise a family. The female lays her eggs in the water, where they are fertilized by the male. The tadpoles hatch in just four or five days. They are much bigger than those of other frogs, so they're easy to identify, but they may take two to three years to mature into frogs. The tadpole in this picture has produced one tiny right hind leg; there's a lot more growing-up work to do.

Bullfrogs eat a lot of insects, flipping out a sticky tongue to pull in a snack. But they will also go for pretty much anything they can get into their wide mouths. Aggressive and voracious predators, bullfrogs will eat small snakes and birds, crayfish, rodents, and other frogs. (Yes, it's a frog-eat-frog world.)

A downside to bullfrogs' dominance is their impact on a local ecosystem. Bullfrogs that are introduced to a new place may shortly extirpate local species—this has been an ecological problem in some areas. In our wetland, bullfrogs predominate over other amphibians. Spring peepers and gray tree frogs still sing from the trees, and wood frogs, green frogs or leopard frogs are occasionally audible or visible, but bullfrogs rule.

Bullfrogs in their turn are hunted, of course. Humans are not the only creatures that delight in frog legs! In our SBP wetland, frogs are hunted by resident redshouldered hawks in the daytime and barred owls at night. Not to mention passers-by like herons and sandpipers. And have you seen the big snapping turtle that frequents the pond and creek? No wonder frogs take cover when they can. Rock ledges near the bridges over Bel Pre Creek sometimes shelter a frog, and pond duckweed often provides camouflage.

Frogs have been around for about 230 million years—since before the dinosaurs. It's safe to say our boss bullfrogs will be with us for a while longer.

Pool Check-in

We have transitioned to a Household-based pool entry system. <u>This means no one will receive paper pool passes this summer.</u>

Once you have paid your 2023 BPRA Annual Assessment (and any outstanding prior year balances) and are properly set up in the BPRA eSoft Planner pool check-in and assessment collection system, you will simply check in with your name at the front desk.

Please see the <u>May 2023 Bugle</u> or <u>StrathmoreBelPre.org</u> for detailed information about how to make sure your eSoft Planner account is properly set up for pool check in.

Only those that reside in your home should be listed in your eSoft Planner account for pool check in. While you are not charged guest fees for your non-resident children, grandchildren, parents, or grandparents, they are still considered guests, not members, and do not have unlimited access to the facility. A household member will have to accompany them the pool and sign them in each time they visit.

If you watch your grandchildren on a regular basis and bring them to the pool as their caregivers, you can add them to your account for ease of check in.

If you need assistance, please visit <u>StrathmoreBelPre.org/pool-access-eSoft</u> and complete the eSoft Planner help form (preferred) or email <u>BPRAPool02@gmail.com</u>. If you do not have access to a computer or email, please call me at (301) 603-9604 before 8pm for assistance.

If you are a new resident, renter, or landlord, please visit <u>StrathmoreBelPre.org/pool-access-eSoft</u> for information on how to get set up for pool check-in. Renters and/or landlords need to complete the help form each summer so that we have accurate records of who is authorized for pool use for a rental property.



For Pool Check In, Who should be listed in my eSoft Planner Account?

Only those that reside in your home should be listed in your BPRA eSoft Planner account. While you are not charged guest fees for your non-resident children, grandchildren, etc, they are still considered guests, not members. As such, they do not have unlimited access to the facility. A household member will have to accompany them to the pool and sign them in each time they visit.

If you watch your grandchildren on a regular basis and bring them to the pool as their caregivers, you can add them to your account for ease of check in. If your grandchildren join the swim team, facility use will be dictated by the Strathmore Bel Pre Dolphins Non-resident Swimmer Policy. In that case the swimmers' parents can accompany the swimmer to the pool without you for swim team practices and events, but they cannot use the pool unless they are signed in by a member as quests.

Paying For Guests!

For guests for which you need to pay, you can either purchase guest passes online before you come to the facility, or pay when you arrive. The passes purchased online show up in your account for use when you check a guest in at the front desk. You will not have a paper pass. Only BPRA members can pay for quests!




Below is our revised 2023 Movie Schedule



Movies for Kids, Movies for All Ages, and Movies for Grown-Ups

It is a challenge to choose movies for our Summer series. We live in a diverse community where tastes vary widely. For the past two years, we have used a community poll via our Civic Association listserv to help us choose the movies.

We conducted two movie polls this year, the first to select our three budgeted movies and a second to select a fourth movie based on fundraising success. Our first movie poll had mostly movies for all ages (e.g., *Top Gun Maverick, Mamma Mia*), and movies for grownups (*Everything Everywhere, The Fabelmans*). It did include one movie for kids (*Ghostbusters: Afterlife*). Here are the results from the first poll:



Our initial movie selections matched the top three vote-getters in this poll.

For our second poll, we added more movies for kids (e.g., Sing 2, Minions: The Rise of Gru, Puss-In Boots) in response to feedback. However, those movies for kids did not fare well in the second poll. Instead, Wakanda Forever won after placing fourth in the original poll. Here are the results from the second poll.



It's curious that the movies for kids did not poll better. We did ask people to only vote for movies that they would go to the pool to see. Since we need darkness, our movies start late, typically 8:30 pm or later. That time is not ideal for children, so that could have been a factor. In the end, the SBPCA felt that we should respect the poll results and show the movies the community selected through the poll. We made an exception for *Otto* because it seemed that the misleading marketing may have impacted polling.
