The scouts of Pack and Troop 763 (sponsored by the Strathmore Bel Pre Civic Association) usually place American flags at the graves of veterans to honor those buried at Gate of Heaven cemetery for Memorial Day. However, our plans are disrupted again this year. We hope that the community will join us on Saturday evening (**May 29**) of Memorial Day weekend to commemorate the people who died of COVID-19 in our zip code.



As of mid-April, 142 people have died in 20906: a luminary will be set out for each person. These luminaries will be a white paper bag with a battery powered candle inside (instead of a candle) to give a

warm light. This display will take place on the pool grounds and will remain in place through Memorial Day (Monday). We welcome the community to join us and we will have additional luminaries if you would like to place one for someone that you know.



Annual Assessments - Your Pool Access

Thank you to those members that have already paid your \$325 annual assessment. If you have not yet paid your 2021 annual assessment, please contact BPRA Treasurer DAVE PULLEN. Email him at treasurer4bpra@gmail.com or call him at (301) 598-2521 to arrange payment and confirm amount due. Payments made after March 31 are subject to a \$32.50 late fee, 6% per annum (\$1.63/month) interest, and collection costs. Access to the pool and related facilities is not permitted for households with accounts in arrears.



NEW - Electronic Pool Use Reservations and Pool Check-in System

This summer, for the first time, we will be using the new BPRA eSoft Planner system for access to the pool. The system will be used for pool use reservations, and for your check-in to the pool itself. This means that you must have an eSoft Planner account to access the pool. BPRA Board members have been hard at work creating basic accounts for each BPRA household.

Please see page 11 for information about what you need to do to make sure your eSoft Planner account is up to date for your pool access. Pool staff will rely on BPRA member-provided information in the eSoft system to manage pool access, so PLEASE be sure that your information is correct and complete.

You can visit www.strathmorebelpre.org/pool-access-esoft for information on how to request an account. Squirrel Tales

Many people assume that if a person feeds birds, he or she must consider gray squirrels, *Sciurus carolinensis*, The Enemy. Those folks chuckle about the birdfeeders that will flip squirrels in the air, in hopes that the furry rodents, once spun into a neighbor's yard, won't find the way back. For me, squirrels are not my enemy; that category is reserved for real villains like garlic mustard and deer. Squirrels are merely a nuisance.

Think, though. If you came upon squirrels unforeseen on another continent, you'd think the people who lived there were lucky to see such charmers every day. Squirrels are cute! Most of our

squirrels are gray in winter, russet-tinted in summer—small soft animals with white bellies and big fluffy tails. Melanistic squirrels, black or brown, are the same species, just wearing a different suit.





Squirrels breed twice a year. Nest dens are usually in tree hollows. We'll be seeing youngsters this spring and then again in the fall. Those round, twiggy, leafy nests high in trees, called dreys, look drafty and unstable, but are good temporary shelters during the warmer months.

Squirrel DNA has evidently evolved to maximize craft, athletics, and food detection. Our squirrels have plenty to eat in our yard, at least seasonally, as we have several black walnut trees, a new pin oak to replace the one that died, two pine trees, a big hickory, and berry-producing shrubs. Seeds, flower buds, galls, mushrooms and insects supplement squirrels' diet. (Don't be surprised this spring if you see them eating cicadas!) Squirrels will also eat birds' eggs and nestlings if they get a chance.

They cache food, burying acorns in winter, then sniffing them out in the spring. Other things they sniff out are tulip bulbs; I have given up planting tulips. Life has enough frustrations without trying to prevent the clever gray gourmands from finding every tasty bulb.

However, squirrels do love a bird feeder, almost any birdfeeder, and will go to great lengths to capture the food. My feeder poles have baffles, but some squirrels are Olympic-quality athletes and can accomplish the almost-impossible. If they're that good, I figure they deserve a few sunflower seeds.

Maybe we should thank squirrels for giving us the opportunity to exercise our little gray cells in attempts to defeat these little gray animals. Today: sending probes to Mars; tomorrow: outwitting squirrels!

Construction Progress

Past months have shown construction begin on several projects reported in earlier versions of this column.

- **Primrose Day Care Center** The Day Care has finally broken ground on their site at the corner of Queensguard and Layhill. You can find details in the May 2018 *Bugle*.
- Gate of Heaven Cemetery Expansion. The Cemetery has begun clearing parts of their forested areas along Connecticut Avenue across from the Post Office. We first reported on this expansion way back in the March 2017 Bugle.
- Kaiser Permanente. Kaiser Permanente has completed demolition of the old Vitro building, behind Home Depot, at the corner of Connecticut Avenue and Aspen Hill Road. eSoft Planner, BPRA's new Member Portal and Pool Check-In System, is now online!

eSoft Planner is live! As we announced in the February *Bugle*, we selected eSoft Planner as our new online pool/community management system. eSoft Planner will streamline and automate many of our processes, enabling pool staff to manage pool access with member-provided information. Members will be able to maintain their own account information, upload photos and add family members for pool access, pay assessments, update contact information, make pool reservations, donate to the pet waste station, and more.



By **May 1**, all BPRA households with valid email addresses on file and annual assessments that were paid in full by **March 31** should receive a welcome email from eSoft Planner with login credentials and links. Check your spam/junk folder if you don't see the email in your inbox. If you paid your assessment after **March 31**, you might receive the email after **May 1**.

Households will not receive login credentials until assessments are up to date. Contact BPRA Treasurer DAVE PULLEN at treasurer4bpra@gmail.com or (301) 598-2521 to arrange for payment so that we can set up an eSoft Planner account for you.

IMPORTANT: Pool staff will rely on the eSoft system and the *information that you provide* to manage pool access, so PLEASE take the time to set up or review your account and make sure that your information is correct and complete by **May 16**.

Please visit strathmorebelpre.org/pool-access-eSoft for more information and detailed instructions on how to log in and:

- 1. Review your **PROFILE**, ensure that your information (name, address, email address) is correct, and make any necessary updates
- 2. **ADD HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS**, and upload photos (for Household access option)
- 3. **ENROLL** in the membership option you want: **SEASON PASS** (two) or **HOUSEHOLD** (if you have already enrolled online, check to be sure that your membership option is correct)
- 4. **VERIFY** that your membership is set up correctly

My profile is set up and ready to go. Now what?

If you have logged into the system and your account is set up, your information is correct, your photos are in the system, and your 2021 assessment is up to date, then you're ready for your first day at the pool. As we continue to add service options in eSoft Planner, pavilion reservations and pool use reservations (when necessary) will be available through the system. Watch future editions of *The Bugle* for updates.

What if I need help with managing my account or have other questions?

Step-by-step instructions for updating household information, adding family members, and uploading photos are posted on the website (StrathmoreBelPre.org/pool-access-esoft). We will also hold another Zoom demo followed by a Q&A session on Thursday, **May 6** at 7 pm. If we are able to hold outdoor gatherings at the pool this spring, we will be available at those events to offer individualized instruction on the new system. BPRA volunteers will be available in person to assist during pool opening weekend. You can also submit a help request via the website and a volunteer will respond within seven days.

- Season Passes We will note in your account that you do not have an email address. Your passes will be mailed to you before the pool opens.
- Household We will note in your account that you do not have an email address. We will work with you to set up your account.

I already completed a form when I paid my assessment. Why can't you just use the information that I provided to set up my account?

With over 700 households in the community, data entry would be too big a job for one or two volunteers to manage. A self-service data entry system will require only a few minutes from each household, versus many hours if volunteers handle data entry. Additionally, self-service reduces the likelihood of errors, and puts members in control of their own accounts.

What will the check-in process at the pool look like?

The pool check-in process will be quick and easy. Household members will give their names to check in. Season Pass holders will show their physical pass to check in. Rather than record check-in information on paper as in years past, the guard at the gate will check each user in on a laptop or other device.

Will I need to make reservations to use the pool?

The public health situation is changing rapidly. As of this writing, we anticipate operating the pool this summer with some version of COVID rules and procedures in place. However, we will continue to monitor County and State guidelines, and will update our procedures as necessary. If pool reservations are required, you will be able to make those reservations online in your eSoft Planner account or by phone. More information and instructions will be posted online at StrathmoreBelPre.org.

Can we reserve the pavilion this summer?

More information on the pavilion will be available at a later date.





Glenmont MetroCentre Phase 2.1

On March 31st, Buchanan Partners presented their updated plans for Phase 2.1 of the project. Phase 2.1 will add a second apartment building across from the recently completed apartment building on Glenallan Avenue. Both are classed as luxury apartment buildings with modern amenities.





New Park

There are also detailed plans for the public space, approximately 30 x 800 ft, between the two apartment buildings. This area includes a fountain feature and a gazebo at the bottom of a terraced lawn that would be suitable for concerts and other outdoor events.

Pursuit of a New Grocery Store

The developers also shared that the successful build-out of Glenmont MetroCentre was renewing interest from major grocers in possibly opening a store on the site. A grocery store at the corner of Glenallan and Georgia Avenues has long been part of the site's development plans.

New Apartment Building

The new apartment building will have a somewhat more modern look than the just-completed building, as shown in the image on the right. This image looks west towards Georgia Avenue along Glenallan Avenue, with the yellow umbrellas near the entrance to the planned new park.



The revised plans also included some minor adjustments to the planned interior road layout on the site. They also changed the schedule for demolishing some of the old apartments, asking the County to permit delaying demolition of two apartments in the Forest buffer until later project phases.

Preliminary Plans only

Buchanan Partners was careful to note that all of the plans presented at this early meeting were preliminary and could change before the Planning Board's upcoming meeting.

Tennis Court Repairs

As reported in the March issue of *The Bugle*, the BPRA is proceeding with long awaited



tennis court repairs. The project includes repairing cracks, eliminating low spots to prevent standing water, converting one tennis court into two pickleball courts and resurfacing and restriping the entire fenced in court area. While we anticipate the work being started in late spring or summer, we do not yet have a start date. Once we have a start date, it will be posted on the website, community listserv and on signs at the tennis courts and the pool.

A few items of note:

- ❖ The courts will be closed for the entire duration of the project. We will change the locks on the tennis courts during construction. Once the project is complete and the courts are open for play, the current tennis court key will work again.
- The expected duration of the project is 1.5 months. This may change based on the weather.
- The tennis court work is temperature and weather dependent.
- ❖ After the project begins, there may be gaps between phases of work to allow materials to properly cure before the application of the next material or layer. The courts cannot be used during those cure periods and will remain locked.
- ❖ Information about the courts' closure and reopening will be posted at the courts, at StrathmoreBelPre.org and sent out via the SBP Civic and SBP Dolphins listservs.




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Strathmore Bel Pre History Project: Old Minutes & *Bugles* wanted

- Strathmore Bel Pre Civic Association minutes (and reports) before 2009




20906 and COVID-19: Update

Since mid-February, the number of new COVID-19 cases in zip code 20906 has plateaued at an average of 7.89 new cases per day. After a December where the average in our zip code was 34.60 new cases a day, this almost brings us down to the levels of last August (7.65 per day).

New COVID-19 cases have also been reported in some of the nursing homes in our zip code between March 3 and April 7: Bedford Court



reported 2 new staff cases and Bel Pre Health Care Center reported 1 new staff case. The Layhill Center reported 2 new resident cases and, sadly, 4 resident deaths.
